

PROGRAMS

Ronald McDonald Houses®

Each night, we keep families with hospitalized children close to the care and resources they need at six area Ronald McDonald Houses. Our Houses, which provide families with comfortable, private rooms, freshly-made meals, activities, and all the comforts of home, are located a short distance from Advocate Children's Hospital, Lovola University Medical Center, Lurie Children's. Northwestern Medicine Central DuPage Hospital, and UChicago Medicine Comer Children's Hospital, and inside Northwestern Medicine Prentice Women's Hospital, Ronald McDonald House allows families to focus on the health of their child by providing access to the best medical care possible.

Ronald McDonald Family Rooms®

Our four Ronald McDonald Family Rooms, located just steps away from pediatric intensive care units in Edward Hospital, Lurie Children's, UChicago Medicine Comer Children's Hospital, and Advocate Children's Hospital, provide a haven of respite and hospitality for families of the most medically fragile children. Family Rooms offer many of the comforts of home including private bedrooms, living spaces, meals, and hospitality for families whose children are receiving treatment.

Ronald McDonald Care Mobiles®

In partnership with Advocate Children's Hospital, we operate two mobile medical units that bring health care directly to underserved children in Chicagoland. This program provides health care and education services to children in neighborhoods where access to primary and preventative care such as immunizations, school physicals, and vision screenings are limited or unavailable. The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile provides an entry point into a regular pattern of health care for vulnerable children, with the goal of connecting the child to a medical home.

2024 YEAR in REVIEW



1. RONALD MCDONALD FAMILY ROOM INSIDE ADVOCATE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL – CELEBRATING 1 YEAR

In its inaugural year, the 4,000-square-foot Ronald McDonald Family Room, located next to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, welcomed over 6,300 visits and provided comfort and support to nearly 150 families.

2. 47TH ANNUAL GALA

Ronald McDonald House friends and supporters gathered to celebrate 47 years of impact, raising an impressive \$1.7 million to support vital programs that help families heal together.

3. NATIONAL VOLUNTEER MONTH

During National Volunteer Week, we honored Joe Hobein, who has lovingly cared for the Ronald McDonald House garden near Lurie Children's for over 45 years. His story was featured on Chicago outlets like WGN, ABC, and WBBM-AM.

4. NEW PLAYGROUND

A big thanks to the Wilch family for donating a new, fully accessible playground at the Ronald McDonald House near Loyola University Medical Center. The vibrant space brings joy and a sense of normalcy to children and families during their stay.

5. ONE DAD'S MISSION

Jeff Bekos, founder of One Dad's Mission, stopped at our House near Lurie Children's during his 4,600-mile bike trek supporting 26 Ronald McDonald Houses. His journey ended in Philadelphia, where his family once stayed 254 nights while daughter Hailey recovered from encephalitis.

6. 20TH ANNUAL RECYCLE WITH RONALD

Hundreds of pop tab collectors gathered at United Scrap Metal in Cicero to celebrate the 20th Recycle with Ronald event. The family-friendly festival marked \$86,000 raised in 2024 to support our mission of keeping families close.

7. ROUND-UP FOR RMHC

The Round-Up for RMHC program had another outstanding year, reaching an incredible milestone of \$3.4 million raised. This simple yet powerful act of rounding up at checkout continues to make a meaningful impact—helping provide vital resources and a comforting home away from home for families when they need it most.

8. CORPORATE CHAMPIONS PROGRAM LAUNCH

In 2024, we launched our Corporate Champions program - a powerful new platform for companies to create purpose-driven impact at both the local and global levels. In its first year, the program's dedicated partners collectively contributed nearly \$1 million, helping us provide critical support to the families we serve.

9. NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY DANCE MARATHON (NUDM)

For its 50th anniversary, NUDM named our local Ronald McDonald House chapter as its primary beneficiary, raising \$342,138 to support the families we serve.

10. SOUTH SIDE IRISH ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE

We were honored to serve as Grand Marshal of the South Side Irish Parade, joining with team members, volunteers, and families for a memorable celebration and meaningful connection with the Oak Lawn community.
